

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The City of Tombstone does not have a certified operator

Our water system does not have a certified operator. As our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we will do to correct the situation. All public water systems in Arizona are required to have a certified operator who has the proper classification and grade level of certificate(s). This operator is responsible for making all decision regarding water quality and quantity

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What is being done?

We are going to contract with a certified remote operator by : **Looking for Grade 2 Operator .**
