**V. VICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:**

**The Marshal's Report – January 10, 2016, through February 14, 2017.**

Chairman Escapule notes a typo on the Marshal's Report date. Date should read January 10, 2017 through February 14, 2017.

Chairman Escapule then turns the floor to Marshal Randall.

Vice Chairman Randall; "Thank you you're Honor." "For the last month we had ten agencies assist, four alarms, six animal problems, one assault, eleven, one criminal damage, two dead bodies, four disorderly conduct calls, eight drug arrest, four DUI's,

seven found properties, two fraud reports, seventeen information reports, one juvenile probation, two lost properties, eight medical, one sex offense, three suspended license, eight suspicious, three traffic accidents, one hundred nine traffic stops with only forty nine citations and two unsecured premises and a bunch of welfare checks.”

“The Palominas Fire Department is sponsoring an EMT training course as I reported last month. It’s been funded by the Tombstone Fire Department I currently have sergeant Mattern and Deputy Gerow in attendance. They are attending this course on their own time Wednesdays and Saturdays. Graduation is scheduled for April 30<sup>th</sup>. At which time they will be certified EMT’s. That’s going to help us out quite a bit because as they respond to the medical calls they will at least have the equipment and the knowledge to take care of the patients.”

“Earlier this month we arrest a female driver for Aggravated DUI and possession of Marijuana. The driver was over .20 with her two small children in the car. She was booked on felony charges and her children were turned over to DCS (Department of Child Services). The next night we arrested two people at the checkpoint for possession of marijuana and possession of dangerous drugs for sale. During that incident we located thirty tabs of LSD a little over three hundred dollars and some paraphernalia. The vehicle’s been seized and we are filing forfeiture based on the sale of dangerous drugs. This vehicle is a two thousand eleven Subaru in great condition. Later that night we made a traffic stop for a headlight out and discovered the driver had a felony warrant, suspended driver’s license and was in possession of dangerous drugs. Our investigation shows the vehicle has been used for transporting illegal drugs and we have filed for forfeiture proceedings on this vehicle also, it’s a two thousand four Lincoln Navigator.”

“TMO Patches, Challenge Coins and Hat Pins are being sold on Facebook and at the office and as expected I am getting a flood of emails and checks coming in. I think that is going to be a good turn around.”

“CCSO and Sierra Vista PD conducted an ALICE training for students at the Tombstone High School on the 9<sup>th</sup> of February.”

“The Marshal’s Department will be presenting a training course on the hazards of SEXTING to the students of Tombstone High School on February 17<sup>th</sup>. This has been rescheduled twice. I already reported on this several times.”

“I have been told of re allocation of funds from the Stone Garden Grant and have requested an additional \$6,000 for overtime and also requested night vision equipment and there is a good chance that that is going to be awarded. I spent the day in Phoenix today at a GOSH; Governor’s Office of Highway Safety Grant meeting. I got a lot of information from that. Speaking with Alberto Guiterre who is the director of GOHS; he likes this part of the county, he likes what we are doing down here in Tombstone and he is going to be providing quite a bit of equipment and some more overtime for us in this coming year.”

“I’ve got Deputy Lohse; is scheduled for basic drug investigations hosted by HIDTA in Chandler; it’s a free course and then Reserve Deputy Blackmer will attend the AZ POST Firearms Instructor School in March 6<sup>th</sup> through the 17<sup>th</sup> and at the completion of that

training he will be able to provide us with firearms training, certification and that sort of thing instead of having to rely on the county or Sierra Vista PD.”

“We’re still at full strength with three active reserves and speaking of reserves they logged forty six hours for the month of January. Contributing eight hundred and five dollars that would normally be paid to a deputy.”

Vice Chairman Randall; “that’s all I’ve got.”

Chairman Escapule; “Any questions?”

There being no questions from the Commission members. Chairman Escapule moves to adjournment.
