V. VICE CHAIRMAN’S REPORT:

The Marshal’s Report – July 12, 2016 through August 9, 2016.

Chairman Escapule; “Marshal the floor is all yours.”

Vice Chairman Randall; “Thank you. For the last month we’ve had 4 agency assist, 7 alarms, 11 animal problems, 2 assaults, 8 citizen assists, 3 criminal damages, 5 disorderly conducts, 2 domestic violence arrests, 4 drug arrests, 3 DUI arrests, 3 fires that we have responded to; 9 information calls, 21 medical calls that we responded to; 2 parking problems, 15 suspicious in nature calls, 5 theft reports, 7 traffic accidents, 112 traffic stops, with 39 citations, 1 unsecured premise and seven welfare checks.

Vice Chairman Randall; "I am happy to report that we have been awarded the Stone Garden Grant. However; at this time it looks like time will be the only benefit. The program will begin in October. As you may recall I asked for quite a bit of equipment out of this grant and when I met with the Border Patrol administration they informed me that a lot of that stuff has changed and right now we will probably just get our overtime; which is good enough."

The vehicles that we have had on order for about ten years have finally arrived. They arrived in Phoenix over the weekend of the twenty ninth. They got delivered to Tucson today for outfitting and I have been told and this may change; I've been told that our first car should be on the road by this weekend."

Vice Chairman Randall; "Some of the training that I have scheduled for the deputies include; tomorrow an in service training referencing use of force. This is a twice a year require course that is taught to most of law enforcement agencies. On October 12th, it is going to be another mentor training for the deputies. It is going to be on legal updates. August 17th, I am sending Deputy Robinson to report writing class in Chandler. During the week of September 13th, through September 16th, I am sending Deputy Robinson and Deputy Blackburn to the general instructor class in Phoenix so that they will be certified to teach various courses to our deputies."

We are still at full strength with our three active reserves and I have two applications for additional. Speaking of Reserves for the month of July the Reserves contributed fifty five and a quarter hours which roughly equates to about nine hundred and sixty dollars that would normally be paid a deputy."

"This is all I've got."

Commissioner Bachman; "I just want to make a comment; with regards to Tuesdays rain and the flooding we had on Charleston Road; and I want to commend your officers and the City for quick response for getting everybody turned around and everybody that stuck in that and I was almost stuck in that; and the quick clean up. I just want to commend everybody for the great job."

Vice Chairman Randall; "Thank you."

Chairman Escapule; "I will say that the Marshal's Office, the old City Hall, we are moving forward. We have taken all of the hazardous material out. That project is in the process of moving forward; going out for bids. The Marshal, Mac and I along with Bonnie Williams and Dave Shambaugh with the architect firm we will have a meeting on Thursday morning to once again reevaluate what we are actually going to be building. As we all know we have limited amount of funds to do this and I have been pulling every angle I can to get enough money to do as much as possible. We are not going to be able to do the second floor at this point in time. We just don't have enough revenues to do that and what we are going to be doing on that bottom floor Thursday is making the bare essentials so that we can get the building occupied and get the Marshal's Office in there and make CDBG or the people from SEAGO happy that it's certificate of occupancy is issued and then we can move forward with private contractors to do the rest of it at a lesser cost. That is where we are at with that. It hasn't been talked about lately. We raised thanks to the people with the Chamber of Commerce and especially Susan Wallace, we've raised almost forty thousand dollars in donation funds from

various organizations and citizens from town. It has been a great effort done by the local folks so this is just to get you caught up on what the Marshal's Office is going to be doing. Hopefully we can have them in that part of the building by mid-summer.

There being no further questions Mayor Escapule closes discussion.
