**Community Development Block Grant Hearing
(CDBG)**

Mayor Escapule; “The City of Tombstone is expected to receive approximately \$215,000.00 in FY17 CDBG funds from the Arizona Department of Housing Regional Account (RA). The City of Tombstone also intends to apply for \$300,000 in FY16 CDBG funds from the State special project (SSP) account. CDBG funds must be used to benefit low-income persons and areas, alleviate slum and blight or address urgent need. This public hearing is to gather citizen input on the use of the CDBG funds.”

“I would like to bring everyone up to speed on what we are doing. I think that the most reasonable thing to do with the CDBG funds. The funds that was approved for fiscal year 2015; Tombstone’s CDBG funds has been allocated to the old City Hall project. We are well into the project and way short of funds and we have talked to the Arizona Department of Housing and they have agreed if the Council agrees they have agreed to allow us to continue to use this next fiscal year two thousand seven CDBG funds toward the old City Hall project. Also we’re applying for the three hundred thousand dollar special project which is kind of a bidding process. It’s a deal where everybody is vying for it however; we are in a pretty good position to get the three hundred thousand dollars back from the Arizona Department of housing however; I did find out today that there will be a twenty percent match if we get the three hundred thousand dollars. In terms of funds that would be sixty thousand dollars that the City would have to match to acquire the three hundred thousand dollars my opinion sixty thousand dollar to get three hundred thousand dollars is not a bad deal because the sixty thousand would also go toward the project. We already discussed in this fiscal budget of adding an additional sixty to eighty thousand dollars into the project in order to keep it moving forward so the purpose of the hearing tonight is if anybody would like to put an input on what they would like to see the funds now is the opportunity to do so and the girls will keep track of it and we will make a list of it. This is your chance to do that and I would like to start with the Council; Ward I Council;

Councilmember Salcido; “We can work on City Hall; get it done and there’s a lot of equipment that needs to be bought.”

Mayor Escapule; “Well this has to go towards something that’s where were low to moderate income also some of the criteria is that it has to go into like law enforcement or public safety. Mr. Barlow what is your feeling on it?”

Councilmember Barlow; “Mayor, first before I give my opinion I have a question. Is there any provision whatsoever for any type of an in kind credit on that sixty thousand dollars or twenty percent?”

Mayor Escapule; "Well at this point I can't answer that. All I can say is that it's really a gamble on whether or not we are even going to get that three hundred thousand dollars much less have to worry about the sixty thousand. I really believe that once"

Councilmember Barlow; "once we get the three hundred thousand we would work it out ..."

Mayor Escapule; "right, negotiate how we would pay the sixty thousand dollars into because I mentioned that we already spent a considerable amount of money putting a new roof on, replacing the bell tower also we demolished the old building on the west side of old City Hall"

Councilmember Barlow; "Yes Sir, I have kept up with this from the get go because it has always bothered me to see a true treasure like City Hall going to rack and ruin when it sat empty for so long. So I know the problems that we have been dealing with. The other administration and this one is a continuation of dealing with and getting the funding and of course having been involved back in 06 on the old City Hall it always cost more to finish a project that you think going in as a historic designated building. I think the urgent need definitely qualifies the City to use that money toward the completion of the project of old City Hall and I certainly would be very much in favor of it."

Mayor Escapule; "Okay and just to clarify the two hundred and fifteen thousand will come to Tombstone whether we get the three hundred thousand or not. Two hundred and fifteen thousand is really the major topic of discussion for this evening."

Councilmember Davis; "I agree. I would like to see us use it to finish the City Hall project but I also think part of this can go to law enforcement correct?"

Mayor Escapule; "It's all for law enforcement."

Councilmember Davis; "All for law enforcement?"

Mayor Escapule; "Yes!"

Councilmember Davis; "I think the City Hall project should be number one."

Councilmember Newbauer; "I completely agree with that. City Hall needs to be finished with the restoration as was said bring a treasure back to Tombstone instead of sitting empty like it's been."

Mayor Escapule; "Would anybody in the audience like to make a comment?"

Jon Donahue (Member of the Public); "I would like to ask; I guess this is to help low income people whether during the restoration of City Hall if some of the work could be done by people that could use some money up to the extent of their skills."

Mayor Escapule; "One of the things that we are not accustomed to is when we are using government funds like the Community Development Block Grant funds we are govern by the government and for example there has to be Davis-Beacon or prevailing wage tied to all the employees that work there. We basically don't get a chance to do much with the project because the contractors and the people that administer the grant are the ones

that actually control it. We have a project manager which is Mac, Michael McMillan of Brown and Associates who has the expertise in this type of project and he is the project manager and stays on top of it that's the only real input that we get to do on it unfortunately along with the Marshal because it is actually going to be the Marshal's Office and we are at the point now where we have put it out for bid once and the bids came in at about six hundred and sixty thousand dollars I believe was the lowest bid. We had a hundred and ninety thousand dollars which is so...what we have done is we've actually convinced the Arizona Department of housing to let us back off regroup re bid it in phases so that we can stabilize the building get the exterior part of the building completed and get the all the ginger bread I call it; all the fancy work out front, get that all completed and then replace the windows and then put an additional staircase in the back of the building to gain ingress egress to the top floor, middle floor and the basement. That would be the first phase were at that we are looking for now. That will get the existing CDBG clear so they can actually call it occupied or ready that we have met our end of the deal. The next part would be to where we can occupy the middle floor. Which is what the two hundred and fifteen thousand that we are looking at here tonight. That would do that and then the three hundred thousand dollars is what we are looking for to totally complete the building; all of the restrooms in and finish it up which would be around the six hundred and some thousand dollars. I think it is a doable thing. I think that in talking to the Arizona Housing they are in favor, they all know the building, they all love the building, there all are trying to do whatever they can to help us preserve the building and save the building. Anyone else have a comment about what they would like to see done with the CDBG funds?

Having no more input Mayor Escapule closes the Community Development Block Hearing.

IV. CALL TO PUBLIC

Mike Caraffa, 1207 E. Allen Street; “I’m kind of confused about something that is on the agenda. Item E is approval to purchase the Franklin Miller; something for the water treatment plant, for about eighteen thousand dollars. I did a public request in January to get what we spent out of the seven hundred thousand dollars

and at that point; as of October 21st we spent six hundred and fifty six thousand and nine dollars and six cents. Then at another council meeting they okayed buying two lift stations pumps for thirty thousand two hundred forty two thousand which brings it to six hundred and eighty six thousand two hundred fifty one and thirteen cents. That left thirteen thousand dollars left in the fund which this grinder is for eighteen thousand but then in January; on January 10th Council Meeting we also approved twelve thousand four hundred and forty two dollars for a pump for Well No. 2. If you take all that into effect it only leave thirteen hundred and six dollars left in the account. My math maybe wrong. I don't know where I missed but the documents I have from the City and from what we voted on we don't have eighteen thousand dollars. We have thirteen hundred and even at that you take out the twelve thousand for the pump we only have thirteen thousand. Thank you.

Duff Chambers, 77 North Saddleback, Chairman of the Healthy Tombstone Committee; "I just want to keep everyone up to date. We are participating with Cochise County on the assessment of the health needs of the community. We meet the second Wednesday of each month at 3:00 p.m. at the Senior Center. What has been identified for us by the survey done by the County is that we have problems with substance abuse and alcoholism, mental health. Our biggest need in Tombstone is not listed in the County assessment. Our biggest need is some form of public transportation so that people aren't limited to Family Dollar, Apache Market or Circle K for getting their things. We do have a food bank where people are able to get commodities as well as fruit and vegetables. If anyone needs to get to a doctor there is one nurse practitioner that is in town. We have enlisted the help of Via Capp, which is a volunteer organization to provide transportation. We are also looking to see if we can solve the ambulance problem. Bruce Nielsen has developed a relationship with the insurance company that provides helicopter transportation for sixty five bucks a year will cover an entire family." Mr. Duff welcomes everyone to the monthly meeting and welcomes everyone to give their input.

DISCUSSION: Mayor Escapule; "I would like to clear some things up. The fact is we have not had an agreement with the Chamber since 2015 as far as the Visitor's Center is concerned and the agreement at Boothill is expired also however; in reviewing this and looking it over we felt that the City needed to step up and start being a little more aggressive and charging the people that's going into the cemetery. I went so far as to get a legal opinion and the legal opinion from Mr. Bays is yes we can charge however; it's going to be three dollars per person and we discussed it and children will be free. We don't; want to charge children to go in to look at graves. It was also in the legal opinion that Tombstone is not an active working cemetery. It has become one of the world renowned tourist attraction and therefore the City has the authority and has the ability to charge individuals to go into Boothill. I think it is the responsibility of this Council and this administration that this City is collecting and taking advantage of every possible avenue of raising funds however; the funds that's been raised by the Boothill Cemetery, not the gift shop, it has nothing to do with the gift shop, those funds can only be used for certain things. They can be used for the maintenance, and the upkeep of both cemeteries it can also be for public safety. Public safety covers a broad spectrum. Law enforcement, Fire Department even Public Works, street problems whatever. Everyone is asking how we are going to pay this full time employee to take care of this. Well the city will take nothing out of your pockets to pay for this position. It will come from the donations for the collection at the gate to pay part of the overhead and that will be part of the overhead. I want to explain the way it's been working is if you have four or five people and I have been spending a lot of time out at Boothill and I see maybe five or six people come out and they would have one or two flyers or one or two maps that means that there was only three to six dollars for four or five people. People come to Tombstone expecting to pay and we should charge these folks to come in and look at one of the most famous cemeteries in the world; Boothill Cemetery in Tombstone, AZ. We're derelicting our duties if we don't do that. We have a fiduciary responsibility to the citizens of Tombstone to make sure that we can do everything we can to collect whatever funds we can. I think it is a positive step for everybody concerned including the Chamber of Commerce because the way we set it up you enter in through the ticket area and you exit through the gift shop. So you have a....actually it's like running cattle into one gate and running them out the shoot where they just got branded or whatever. We are going to try and do the same thing. I think it will work. We have repainted everything down there, we clean it up. I don't know if anyone has been down there to check it over. The place looks great. Both buildings look good, brand new signs, big signs; brand new. There will be a sign go up on the smaller building probably Thursday afternoon and then there are signs inside and out the back of the buildings that will give people direction on which way to go. I think it's a positive move for us and to touch on the Visitor Center we haven't made any decision on and I've told Susan and Dave both that it's probably a month away before we are in a position to where we can work with the Visitor Center. I think at one time and I appreciate everything the Chamber has done over the years to try and help the City of Tombstone keep things rolling. It's just like State Parks, the City of Tombstone helped State Parks when they were going to close up the Courthouse. We kept the Courthouse open but now State Parks is back up and rolling and they want to take it back and I think the twenty seventh they will in fact be taking the State Parks building back; the Old Courthouse. So it is kind of the same scenario with the City of Tombstone and the Chamber and we appreciate what the Chamber

has done and we appreciate that the Chamber is continually working and working hard and diligently to try to promote Tombstone. It's not really their business to be running some of the City's businesses. We appreciate what they have done over the past and it's time we take care of our own responsibilities.

Councilmember Barlow "I think the Council needs to look at it really hard and in creating of a full time position whether it's called a manager or something else. Full time position will be getting all the benefits and FICA matching and all the other cost of a full-time employee is eligible for. In years past I have donated a lot of volunteer hours out there. I've taken the donation money then and I think if we think from a budget standpoint of expending money; I think we need to look at this really hard and if we hire four part-time people they can do the job, they can do it well and if we take one of them and pay them fifty cents more and let them do the scheduling, I think this would work and we can save the money and we can make money to be applied elsewhere.

Mayor Escapule; "Just to let you know before I did discuss this in depth and in detail with Ruben Villa. I understand where Mr. Barlow is coming from but I still think that we need to create a position where we have somebody that can be held responsible and not a part-time employee it has to be somebody that is a City employee."

Councilmember Davis; "Would that be just one employee, one full-time employee?"

Mayor Escapule; "Yes; one full-time employee!"

Councilmember Davis; "So there would not be any part-timers?"

Mayor Escapule; No, they are all part-time employees except for one and the part-time employees I am not sure just exactly how the schedule is or how Brenda got the schedule worked out. How many employees?"

Interim City Clerk Ikirt; "Part-time employees can only put nineteen hours a week. Thirty eight every two weeks otherwise we have to put them on Arizona State Retirement."

Councilmember Barlow; "how many part-time people are you allocating Brenda at this time?"

Interim City Clerk Ikirt; "For now we are going to get four until we can get the schedule going."

Councilmember Barlow; "If you go four part-time, nineteen hour, that's seventy six hours of covering the gate and that's more than average to do the job.

Interim City Clerk Ikirt: "It will cover some of them because some of the employees that were interviewed cannot do weekends. So like two employees that said that they don't care they will do weekends or whenever if somebody calls in they are available. Those two employees are probably going to have the thirty eight, the other two that we discussed they are not going to have the thirty

eight every two weeks because they can't do the weekends. It will come out to where it will be open and every two weeks they will not go over the nineteen hours a week. They will have only the thirty eight every two weeks."

Councilmember Davis; "It sounds to me like it's going to be a fairly difficult job to get a diligent full-time person. That could be a real problem."

Mayor Escapule; "Well I can tell you this it's harder to get a part time person that would be willing to take that responsibility."
